The large-scale desalination plant being developed by Consolidated Water at Rosarito in Mexico has long been hyped as an alternative to siting a plant in California. Will any of the plant's output make it north of the border?

A public tender could be launched within months for the longplanned 100MGD (378,500m3/d) seawater desalination plant at Rosarito Beach (Mexico), after project proponent NSC Agua submitted a detailed proposal to the State of Baja California late last quarter.

Given the amount of work put into the project by NSC Agua (which is 99.9% owned by Nasdaq-listed Consolidated Water) – and the fact that the project proponent is expected to benefit from a 10% bid discount – it seems highly unlikely that a serious rival bid will come forward.

don't see anybody else even taking a swing at this - how would you?" said one source close to the project. "You don't have the ground, you can't co-locate with the power plant, and you don't have the rightof-way to get the water up to northern Mexico," he told GWI.

Although the project has frequently been hyped as a way of getting desalinated water to the US without having to jump through all the permitting hoops associated with siting a facility in California, the most intriguing question of all is whether any of the water will actually make it into the US.

Despite the fact that Otay Water District signed a non-binding letter of intent in 2012 to purchase water from the project, the State of Baia California last November made a proposal to NSC Agua to purchase the plant's entire output, and simultaneously appointed Rodney Smith of Baja Norte Water Resources to explore the potential of on-selling up to half the plant's output to US water users. A final decision on how the water will be apportioned is expected in October 2015.

This raises several interesting questions. While it may be tempting for NSC Agua to sign a single offtake agreement for the entirety of the plant's output, Baja's international credit rating was downgraded to Baa3 by Moody's last October, putting it on the cusp of junk status, while both Standard and Poor's and Fitch rate Otay Water District in the "AA" bracket. The credit quality of the offtaker consortium will inevitably affect the risk profile of the project, which will impact on the size of the debt service payments associated with the project finance that the developer will need to put in place.

It also raises questions over the extent to which California is being held hostage by the authorities in Mexico. Should Baja end up owning the plant's entire output, it can theoretically charge US users whatever it likes for the desalinated water, with the added kicker of being in a strong position to monetise some of its existing Colorado River water rights in order to subsidise the unit cost of the desalinated water to its

We Are Family

Musical groups featuring closely related performers are not a new phenomenon. Pre-WWII examples in the U.S.A included the Andrews Sisters and The Mills Brothers. Back in the 1970's, Viola Williams, a Juilliard alumna, started vocal training her daughter's four young children. They began performing at local church and community functions as 'Mrs. Williams' Granddaughters.' As the quartet of youngsters...Debbie, Joni, Kathy & Kim...became more polished, their mother Florez (wife of renowned Broadway actor Edward Sledge) took over as their professional manager and changed the name of the quartet to 'Sister Sledge.' It's only true when sung by one specific member of this uber-talented sextet. We promise to reveal the secret to our riddle before we complete our story.





Buying a home in Baja: The right time, the right price.

A 2014 study by the real estate search engine Zillow revealed that the median value of a San Diego waterfront home is \$1,924,500. That's nearly 3.5 times the \$564,900 median for regular single-family homes in San Diego. The gap is still greater in Long Beach, California.

Certainly, the economic downfall of 2008 brought sales in the Rosarito area almost to a halt. But now the outlook is very positive. In 2014 we experienced a 50 percent increase in property sales, in relation to the previous year, and are expecting that in 2015 we will register the highest levels of sales in the last 5 years.

Part of this increase can surely be attributed to improvements at the border and to the bustling social scene at the Rosarito-Ensenada corridor.

The lovely Baja seashore is still lovelier now that border waits are down. At the busiest border crossing in the world, waiting periods have dropped to less than 45 minutes since vehicle lanes were added in September 2014. At certain times, the wait can be as low as 10 minutes. According to the U.S. Customs and Border Protection, delays have decreased between 50% and 75% from previous years. "Shorter lines have fueled a 20 percent increase in passengers, luring more Americans to Mexico for family visits or getaway weekends," reported NBC San Diego. More improvements in this area are to come once the \$735 million border expansion project is completed.

The twenty minute drive from San Ysidro to the San Diego airport is an easy one too, as many of our Canadian clients have



commented.




